## 1. Purpose and Reasons

- 1.1 To share with the Health and Wellbeing Board the proposed plans for Swindon, working with Wiltshire to implement the changes required as stated within the Transforming Care programme.
- 1.2 As part of the governance requirements prior to final submission to NHS England the plan must be shared and signed off by the Health and Wellbeing Board.

## 3. Detail

Background and national context

- 3.1 In 2012, following an investigation into criminal abuse at Winterbourne View Hospital, the Department of Health initiated a national programme of action "Transforming Care" to transform services for people with learning disabilities and/or autism who have mental health conditions or behaviours that are challenging. Transforming care aims to reshape services for people with learning disabilities and autism away from institutional models of care, closing some inpatient provision and strengthening the support available in the community.
- 3.2 On 12 June 2015, Health and Wellbeing boards received a letter from NHS England, the Local Government Association (LGA), the Association of Directors of Adult Social Services (ADASS), Health Education England (HEE), Care Quality Commission (CQC) and the Department of Health which describes how they are collaborating on a cross-system Transforming Care programme Agree how the Health and Wellbeing Board wishes to receive updates on the implementation progress.

- 3.3 Five 'fast track areas' (collaborations of CCGs, Local Authorities and NHS England specialised commissioners) piloted delivering Transforming Care approaches.
- 3.4 The attached document is the local plan of Wiltshire and Swindon for transforming services for people of all ages with a learning disability and/or autism who display behaviour that challenges, including those with a mental health condition, in line with *Building the Right Support – a national plan to develop community services and close inpatient facilities* (NHS England, LGA, ADASS, 2015). This Plan covers 2016/17, 2017/18 and 2018/19.
- 3.5 The plans demonstrates how Wiltshire and Swindon will fully implement the national service model (published with above document) by March 2019 reducing the use of and/or closing any inpatient beds using the national planning assumptions set out in *Building the Right Support*, that no area should need more inpatient capacity than is necessary at any one time.
- 10-15 inpatients in CCG-commissioned beds (such as those in assessment and treatment units) per million population
  - 20-25 inpatients in NHS England-commissioned beds (such as those in low-, medium- or high-secure units) per million population
- 3.6 These planning assumptions have been used by commissioners in producing this plan. A creative and ambitious approach has been taken, based on a strong understanding of the needs and aspirations of people with a learning disability and/or autism, their families and carers, and on expert advice from clinicians, providers and others. It should be noted that Wiltshire and Swindon current use of beds is already much lower than the above planning assumption.
