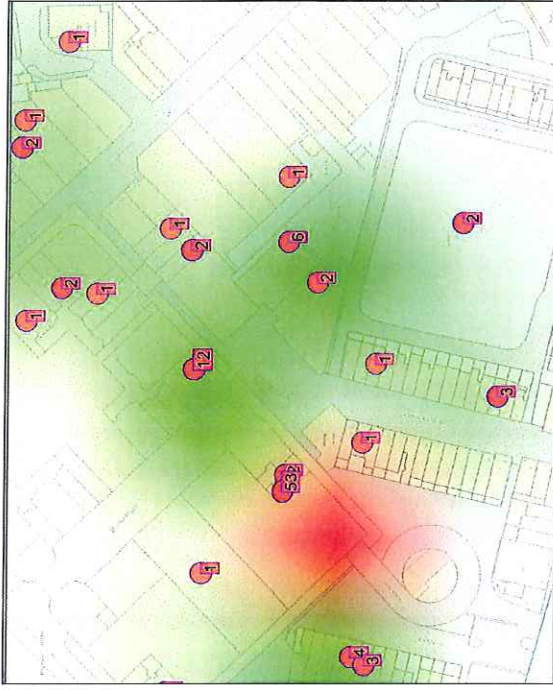


#### 4. Havelock Square analysis

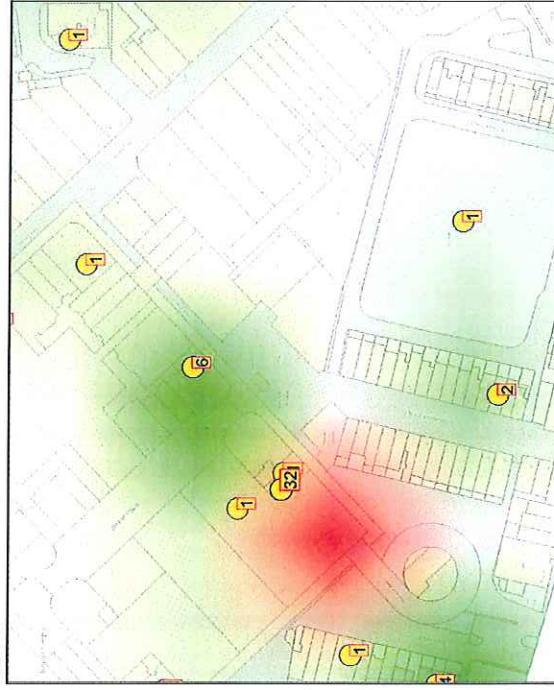

Hotspot analysis around the Havelock Square identifies a change from 2009 – 2013. From 2009 – 2011 the area represents a hotspot for NTE offences and as already stated, features in the top streets. From 2012 onwards the hotspot no longer exists and the amount of offences has reduced significantly. This could be attributed to the closure of NTE establishments in the Havelock Square since 2011.

The reduction of the hotspot it likely to have caused some displacement as people will be frequenting other NTE establishments. The emerging hotspots in Victoria Road and Old Town shown on the maps on page 6 could be attributed to this.

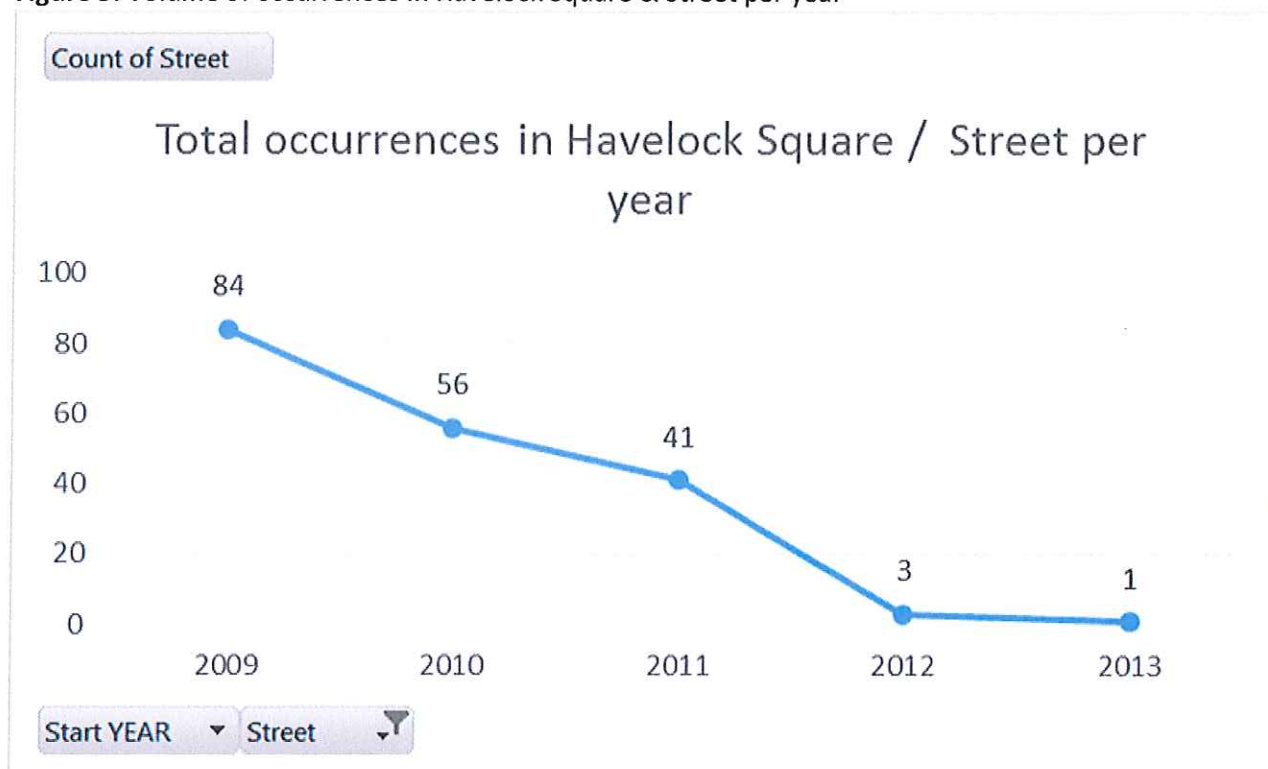

Figure 3 and Table 3 show the volume of offences in Havelock Square & Havelock Street each year. Table 3 also shows the type of offences. It can clearly be seen that volume reduces each year and so far in 2013 only one offence has been recorded in the area during the NTE hours. Table 3 shows that the most common offence is Violence.

Peak time analysis for offences in Havelock Square identifies that peak days are Friday, Saturday & Sunday, each experiencing the same number of offences. The peak hour on each of these days is between 0300 – 0400.

Table 4 shows the peak day and time for offences in Havelock Square & Street for each year. It can be seen that from 2009 – 2011 the peak time is between 0300 and 0400, this could be attributed to the time after NTE establishments have closed. Although the peak time/ day has been included for 2012 and 2013 it should be noted that the volume is much lower (see table 3) for these years.

## **5. Recommendations**

---

- If a new establishment is to reopen in the Havelock Square area, occurrences during the NTE hours are likely to increase. Depending on the licensing hours, the majority of offences are likely to occur after around the hours of closure
- Adequate security and training of staff is required to ensure the appropriate measures are in place to deal with any offences
- Pubwatch scheme to be implemented at new establishment to ensure that those likely to cause the most harm are monitored
- Consider use of street pastors with the aim to resolve conflict before it escalates
- Consider use of ID scanners to identify those causing problems
