Wiltshire Police have identified that there has been an increase in crime and disorder in the area the Brunel Rooms is situated and since the opening of the premises on the 1st August 2013 there have been a number of arrests and incidents directly attributable to the premises.

There have also been breaches of licence conditions and the premises was identified as allowing glass bottles into the main area of the nightclub which is prohibited and on this same evening a male was assaulted with a glass bottle and injured.

The additional information attached to this review application provides evidence of the incidents at the premises which also highlights that many of the individuals involved have high levels of drunkenness.

There is evidence that there has been disregard by the premises management and owners for public safety and they have been in part responsible for members of the public becoming victims of crime resulting in physical injury.

When the premises licence application was applied for efforts were made to ensure the premises would be able to ensure the licensing objectives could be achieved through the conditioning of the licence. It has become apparent that conditioning the licence has had limited success and has seen the premises management and licence holders fail to uphold these. On occasions they have shown to have little regard for the licence conditions allowing entry to the premises to friends and acquaintances after the last entry time.

Wiltshire Police have maintained regular contact with the DPS of the premises in the form of monthly meetings and email exchanges in order to prevent incidents occurring at the premises. However incidents have continued and there has been no evidence of other members of the management team taking on board our concerns and those of the DPS.

Wiltshire Police feel that they have been left with no option than to request the licensing committee consider revocation of the premises licence in order to protect the public and prevent further crime and disorder at the premises.

Should the committee consider revocation inappropriate then Wiltshire Police would ask that a period of suspension to the premises licence be made to allow the premises to reorganise and change their management structure and team. We also request that the management team undertake some form of qualification that will provide them with the knowledge and understanding in relation to their duties as operators of a licensed premise.

As well as a period of suspension the committee are asked for further conditions be imposed onto the premises licence

- 1) To prevent Jason Ranford from being present and having an operational role at the premises when it is open to members of the public and
- 2) that only polycarbonate/plastic receptacles be used throughout the entire premises.
