1. Purpose and Reasons

- 1.1 To consider a reference from the meeting of the Health and Wellbeing Board held on 13th July 2016 that the refreshed Swindon Breastfeeding Strategy for 2016/2020 be adopted.
- 1.2 To consider a reference from the meeting of the Swindon Community Safety Partnership Board meeting on 19th July 2016 that Cabinet notes and comments on the Draft Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPO) guidance.
- 1.3 The references support the Council's Vision Priority Four: "Help people to help themselves while always protecting our most vulnerable children and adults" and Priority Three: "Ensure clean and safe streets and improve our public spaces and local culture" respectively.

3. Detail

Reference from the Health and Wellbeing Board

- 3.1 At its meeting on 13th July 2016, the Health and Wellbeing Board considered a report the Director of Public Health regarding the refresh of the Swindon Breastfeeding Strategy.
- 3.2 The Board noted that there was strong evidence that Breastfeeding improves the health of babies and their mothers and that, in order to improve breastfeeding prevalence and to give a strategic direction, Swindon has had a ratified breastfeeding strategy since 2008 which is used by all key stakeholders, including the Children, Families and Community Health Services at Swindon Borough Council (SBC) and the maternity services at the Great Western Hospital.
- 3.3 Since the previous strategy was out of date, it had been determined that the strategy should be refreshed, rather than re-written, as there has been no national or local change to policy or procedure.
- 3.4 The Board resolved –
- (1) That Swindon Borough Council's Cabinet and the Swindon Clinical Commissioning Group Governing Body be recommended to adopt the refreshed Swindon Breastfeeding Strategy for 2016/2020.**
- (2) That the Board's congratulations to Swindon's Health Visitors on their achievement in being awarded the full accreditation to the prestigious Unicef Baby Friendly Programme be recorded.

- 3.6 At its meeting on 19th July 2016, the Swindon Community Safety Partnership Board received a report inviting its members to review the statement of procedures that standardise the process of introduction, consultation, variation and discharge of public spaces protection orders (PSPO) across the Council. 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report also addressed issues relating to the enforcement of a PSPO, appeals against the issue of PSPOs and the withdrawal of PSPOs.

- 3.7 The Board agreed that the Draft Guidance be approved and that partner agencies to refer it to their respective decision making bodies (Cabinet) to note and comment (Appendix 3).
- 3.8 A copy of the Public Spaces Protection Orders Guidance is attached at Appendix 4.
